

Consider giving this route a try. At a brisk pace it'll be a half-hour well spent strolling past some beautiful historic architecture that speaks to the enduring quality of downtown Atlanta - and you might be healthier for it!

★ Constellations

- The Auburn Avenue Research Library has a core collection that debuted in July of 1921, when it was housed in a one-story red brick building less than a 1/2 mile from where it is today.
- 2. Circa 1907, this building was once home to the Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company. A 1922 addition housed machine switching technology, which provided users with a true dial tone.
- 3. The 11-story Flatiron Building, Atlanta's oldest standing skyscraper, was completed in 1897. The first skyscraper in our fair city was the Equitable Building of 1892, which stood at the corner of Edgewood Avenue and Park Place, was demolished in 1971.

- 4. U.S. Post Office and Courthouse is home to the Court of Appeals for the 11th Circuit. When ground was broken in 1907, workers discovered a natural rock formation that resembled an American eagle, which observers interpreted to mean that the federal building was destined for this site. This building has a spectacular iron arch facing Fairlie Street that spans the entry to a former outdoor courtyard.
- 5. Looking for a change of scenery? Spend some time in Woodruff Park and take advantage of the available Wi-Fi to stay productive.
- Standing 17 stories tall, the Hurt Building was once the 17th tallest building in the world. Today, that distinction is held by the Petronas Towers in Kuala Lumpur, both of which are 88 stories tall.
- 7. Refuge Coffee Co. is home to some of Atlanta's best coffee and most grateful people, stop in and enjoy both.
